The drop in the number of runners at the Championships was not unexpected. Location, location, location. Numbers tend to fall away the further from Wimbledon Common one goes. However, the essence of cross country running is the diversity of courses and for those like me who think that cross country is not only about running on gravel, I like to move the fixture around our catchment area. More importantly this is also fairer on our host clubs and gives those who live further away from London an occasional local fixture. Knowing that Aldershot would be too far for some (gone are the days when clubs would travel from Bristol and even Cardiff) I pestered most of the clubs in Hampshire, Berkshire and west Surrey who were not already affiliated to our Association with emails, in an attempt to regain some of the ground lost to fixture congestion over the years. In the end only four clubs responded and of those, only Blackwater Valley Runners and Winchester & District AC sent runners to the championships. I hope that they enjoyed the experience and will join us again in future years.

Numbers were also down in the 5 mile race, due to an unexpected clash with a Kent League Race. I try to warn off the various cross-country leagues from our usual dates of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday in December and the last Saturday in November but was unsuccessful on this occasion. I assumed wrongly that Kent AC would know about the Kent League (they run in the Surrey League) and so only found out about the clash when it was too late to move the race date.

I should like to thank our host clubs Aldershot, F& D AC and Kent AC for their efforts in providing courses and facilities for our races and Don Turner for dealing with the important work of finding officials, sorting out entries, results etc not to mention his work as Treasurer. However, Don and myself are old dinosaurs, still living in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Online banking, social media like Facebook are a closed book to us. Whilst we are prepared to carry on whilst our health allows, (my predecessor died when he was younger than I am now, and Don is 8 years older than me), it may be that there are younger people out there who would help bring us into the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

Finally, the Association relies heavily on keeping in contact with the member clubs. Many clubs change their contact (be they called team manager, cross country secretary or team captain) on an almost yearly basis. It is vital that we are informed of these changes as often the new incumbent is not aware of our races and the connection between the Association and the club can be lost and their membership and participation in our races can cease.
